## **Gordon International Medal Competition**

On March 16, 17, 18, 2023 the Gordon International Medal Competition is back and will be played in the Montreal area. The Grand National Curling Club of America will field 20 teams for this competition which includes Friendly and Medal games. While Canada is planning 30 for the Friendly and 40 for the Medal games.

A reception (cash bar) and a roast beef dinner will be held at Olympia Reception Hall, 3855 Boul. St Jean A, Dollard-des-Ormeaux on Saturday, March 18, 2023, starting at 6 pm.

*By tradition, this is an all male event, both on the ice and at the dinner.*

The cost of hosting has greatly increased over the last few years and we had to raise the cost of the entry. Cost for the Friendlies and Gordon Medal games, is \$500.00. To play only the Gordon Medal game, the cost is \$300.00, with banquet. Lunch is included Friday and for teams playing Saturday morning. Payment must accompany your entry. Please bear in mind that the American players are our guests at the dinner. Banquet attire should include jacket and tie. Priority will be given to entries received before January 15, 2023.
